1. Brian cited Bill Bishop's research that shows: "In 1976 less than 25 percent of Americans lived in places where the presidential election was a landslide. 4. As we come out of the Covid-19 pandemic, are you more or less judgmental of people?
5. Covid-19 has created more of an ideological divide in our world. How can you apply the three things Brian talked about:
 1. People are hard to hate close-up. Move in.
 2. Listen.
 3. Watch the movie *Castaway*, and feel the emotion of re-entering society.
